

Countless animals owe their lives to Heather! Both family and friends know at least one animal story from her that make them smile.


We will always remember Heather and these stories, knowing she is at peace on the other side of Rainbow Bridge.

All the Family Fare receipts have paid off... to the tune of \$1,000 for the first check! Don't stop collecting, we are well on our way to a 3rd big check!






Note: Read your peanut butter label. Dogs are pretty nuts about peanut butter, but before you offer it as a treat, you'll want to check the ingredients. Some brands contain xylitol, an artificial sweetener that is very dangerous to dogs.
