

Logan's Law Update:

This bill would make a registry of those convicted of animal abuse, and require any animal shelter to refuse sale/adoption of an animal to anyone on the list.

House Bills: 4353/4355 and Senate Bills: 219/220, has the opportunity to benefit both animals and humans.



Senate Bill 239, which is now headed to the state house, would make it illegal for communities to ban certain dog breeds, including pit bulls.

According to the Associated Press, there are 27 communities in Michigan that have breed restrictions in place, like the Village of Kalkaska.

"Viciousness or aggressiveness of a dog, whether it's with other dogs or pit bulls, is really determined by many, many factors," said Kim Nelson, a dog trainer. "It really has very little to do with breed."

Those factors can include how and where the dog is raised and the behavior it's taught. "It depends on their environment and how they're trained in the first couple of months of life," said Nelson. "It depends on the circumstances in that particular moment, not only who and what is in the environment, but the type of environment."

Nelson says every case is different which is why she believes every dog should be treated on an individual basis rather than singling out specific breeds considered to be vicious.

Senator Dave Robertson, the sponsor of Senate Bill 239, agrees. "What we're talking about here are domesticated animals. There is nothing about a domesticated breed that is by itself inherently vicious, unless an owner trains that animal to be vicious or through abuse and neglect." Robertson says the bill will put more responsibility on the dog owner.

"I think it's going to be better because it's more genuinely humane, my legislation is genuinely more humane." said Robertson.
